

## Veterans Spotlight

He was the oldest of 13 growing up on a farm in Eaglebend, MN. At just 17 years old he joined the US Navy with World WarII in full swing, William G. Hadley shipped out to the Great Lakes Training Center in December 1944 for basic training, then on to the Navy Corpsman/Medic School in San Diego California. When asked why he joined the navy, Bill replied with a laugh, "cause I didn't want to sleep on the ground or in a foxhole". After Corpsman school, Bill received his orders to Camp Schumacher in Hayward, California. There he worked in the Navy hospital until the war was over.

With new orders in hand, he boarded a converted German Luxury liner, the USS Lejeune with 4000 other troops. Enjoying the converted ship with three swimming pools on deck they headed to



the Philippines to join the rebuilding efforts. His duties assigned him to a small medical hospital caring for sailors and Sea Bee units. Everyone quartered and worked out of 10 Quonset Huts where they lived and performed their duties.

Bill's enlistment ended in November 1947 at the same place he began. The ETS out processing station was at Camp Schumacher in Hayward, California. It had recently been converted to handle the discharging of soldiers after the war.

He stayed in California for about a year, determined to not return home in the middle of the winter. Also, not knowing that would be the best decision of his life. It was in early 1948 when he met Annie Lane who he dated, married and moved to Minnesota in June 1948, where the newlyweds would make their home and raise their family. They have one daughter, Glenda, two sons, Rodney and Bob. Both of their sons served in the US Army in Vietnam. They were married for 67 years when Annie passed away on September 13, 2015.

When they arrived in Minnesota, Bill wasn't sure what type of work he wanted to do so he became a Commercial Tourist with routes out east which he ran for 41 years hauling Fords out of the St Paul factory, eggs to Boston, and various manufactured goods. Bill worked for Murphy Motor Freight and Franklin Manufacturing out of St Cloud, as well as trying his hand as an Owner Operator. Bill finally retired at 86 from the Ryder Rental Truck company with runs throughout the Midwest.

Bill has been a member of the American Legion for 65 years, starting his membership with the Coon Rapids American Legion in 1956. There he served in many different capacities including the building committee. After moving to Otsego in 1993, he transferred his membership to the Elk River Post. When asked what brought him to join the American Legion? Bill's response was that he wanted to belong to an organization that served veterans.

Bill talks with his remaining 2 brothers and 3 sisters almost every day and enjoys weekly lunches with his grandkids at Shorewood Forest in Milaca. He stays active and enjoys coffee with his friends at Denny's in Rogers. He is also a steady attendee to the Saturday morning donuts and coffee with the Commander at the Post. Bill often times brings a great friend of his and Annie's, Florence Bubalo. If you have ever met Bill, you are quickly drawn in by his laugh and smile. He really enjoys Post 112 and all of the friendships he has made through the years. If you get a chance, stop by, and say hello to another treasure from The Greatest Generation.
