Commander's News Sept - Oct 2023

Hello American Legion Family of Post 112!

My hope is that everyone is doing well.

On 8/9/23, accompanied by Adjutant Crow, Aux President Smith, Chaplain Denesen and 2nd Vice Quammen, we presented The Bank of Elk River with final payment to our mortgage which was years early.

My article this month has some great and bad to it and I want to inform the Legion Family of what has been accomplished and is currently happening.

The first thing to report is that your Legion Post is financially sound.

When you think about it during Covid we were not sure how we would end up. I can remember working on every fish fry during Covid with some very resolute volunteers. We reopened and pushed forward. In a Post Covid world we have been moving forward as an American Legion.

Here are some of our accomplishments:

- *We paid off the mortgage early.
- *We paid off the rest of the last parking lot loan.
- *We added about \$30K to our Building Fund
- *We have refurbished the post
- *We just finished the roof
- *We finished the entry way
- *We have an abundant parking lot fund with generous donors on board by the end of the year
- *We are doing well in comparison to many businesses around us. We have endured Covid, an aggressive police department who handed out DWI's like candy to which has mostly emptied the bar, and Construction that has been going on for 2 years so far. Not to mention an economy that has lowered most people's extra money to spend.
- *Our Honor Guard is highly visible and regularly active.
- *Our wonderful Auxiliary came from Convention with 2 Awards and 9 Certificates of Merit
- *We are back on the map as a successful post.
- * First and foremost, we have an actual accountant that keeps us straight as far as finances, taxes, compliance, and all the new regulations. Jennifer has installed the necessary checks and balances needed with so much cash flow. There are some more that should install. These checks and balances that Jennifer helped to implement are quite common and necessary in every business. Letting go of this is a grave mistake.
- *We installed a new POS system with more checks and balances and does not cost us anything.

- *The new POS system with its C/C fee system. It averaged over \$1000 a month and now averages under \$500 a month. That saves the post approximately \$6000/year.
- *We made personnel changes at the beginning of the year due to drawer shortages. As of the month end July, the drawers were only short \$206 compared to almost \$3000 in July 2022. That is what the checks and balances are doing in your post.
- *We have decreased the monthly expenses by \$3000/mo.
- *We now have a new cook who is an Iraq War Veteran set to start after Labor Day.
- * One great accomplishment is a bridge that is being built currently with the VFW Post 5518. We extended a prosperous branch to them, and it has been reported that they have said they are excited about it.
- * We are blessed to have a VERY active Chaplain and PSO. Chaplain Paul is doing mazing work in our community. He is doing God's work. **All I can say is THANK YOU JESUS. AMEN!**
- * Something we have done is to bring God back to the Legion. <u>As the Preamble states, For GOD and country.</u> It means what it says, and it does not say for the bar or the kitchen.
- * We follow the *FOUR PILLARS of the AMERICAN LEGIONS FOUNDING*. We are an American Legion first.

Many thanks to our fellow members that have served relentlessly with us for the betterment of Post 112. In confidence of the accomplishments, it is my sincere hope the Post continues to flourish and gain the community's support under new leadership as I have resigned as Post Commander and Honor Guard of the Davis-Darrow-Meyer American Legion Post 112.

Auxiliary Spotlight

Marcy Schulze

President Smith and I had the pleasure of driving to Aitkin, Minnesota on August 14th to interview Marcy Schulze for this Auxiliary Spotlight.

She grew up on a farm in Perham, with her parents and two sisters. She attended a country school with 32 students. There were 6 kids in her class that went through 1st grade all the way to graduation. Following graduation she moved to Minneapolis staying with her sister. There was a drugstore in the neighborhood with a restaurant in need of a waitress. As Marcy had experience as a waitress in Perham, she was hired on and worked there for 3 years. That was where she met her husband, Weldon, better known as "Waddy", in 1956. He served in the Army from 1950 to 1953.



They were married in 1958 and had three children. A son lives in Ely and a son and daughter are deceased. Marcy has 7 grandchildren and 13 grandchildren that often keep her company. After living in St. Paul, in 1964 they moved to a farm east of Elk River where they raised pigs until retirement in 1998. Today the Trout Brook housing development is located on the farm site. Big Pine Lake in Aitkin was the site of their cabin throughout the years and was where they built their retirement home. The home is located on the lake with lots of feeders for all the birds and squirrels to watch for entertainment. The number of hummingbirds at the feeders was somewhat of a distraction while talking with Marcy. This past spring a bear checked out all the feeders too.

Marcy joined the Auxiliary in 1968. Waddy had been active in the Post and was Commander from 1971 to 1972. She recalls he always had raffle tickets in his pockets to sell for some Legion event. Dinners, bake sales, smelt fries, and sausage dinners were some of the activities the Auxiliary was involved with. The Schulzes always donated a pig for the sausage dinner and Elk River Meats would do the processing. She also recalls a fish dinner where the Legionnaires caught lots of fish, brought them back to the Post and everyone pitched in to clean them for a fish dinner. Senior Dances every 3rd Thursday of the month were held at the legion from 1-4 pm with the Auxiliary serving lunch afterwards. Assisting the schools with the administration of hearing tests was another volunteer activity. Marcy made and decorated beautiful cakes for the Veterans Hospital and Legion Events.

When the topic of attending conventions came up, Marcy got a big smile on her face and shared the following story. She couldn't remember the year that the District Convention was held in Elk River. A Lund boat was being given away. Bill Dollansky hooked the boat up to his motorcycle with Marcy, Lois Lundemo, Margaret Tarnowski, Bev Norelle and Dorothy Uhl riding in the boat as he paraded it down the street.

In her spare time Marcy crochets afghans for all her family members, completes beautiful diamond dot pictures and tends to all her beautiful flowers.
