Post Service Office

The following is a *year-end total summary* of Post Service Officer duties performed since inauguration 2 June 2022 through 21 December 2022:

Prior to the Coved 19 lockdowns, Post 112 Leadership had hoped to conduct a "veteran's benefit review" as a public service to the surrounding communities. After the restrictions, during the summer of 2022, two planning meetings were conducted coordinating Sherburne County Veteran's Service Office Staff, state and local government officials, Federal veteran organizations, and other surrounding area volunteer veteran services organizations. On 29 September Post 112 conducted its first outreach to Sherburne and Benton Counties veterans and spouses and provided a complete Veteran Benefit Review to make certain each veteran received the benefits for which they are eligible. 85 veterans and 20 additional spouses attended this all-day event. 35 veterans scheduled follow up visits with county representatives to proceed with claims and records updates. In addition to the Post 112 supporting members and the County Veteran Service Office; there were 11 Federal and local veteran volunteer service agencies assisting. 6th District Commander O'Bar was in attendance to support the mission to serve Veteran's Affairs and Rehabilitation within our community which is a primary pillar of the American Legion. Looking at the total numbers of veterans and spouses served, this was an event each and every member of Post 112 can rightly be proud of!

In addition, three referrals were made for medical equipment to the Sherburne County Veterans Service Office (CVSO) and a vet service support organization. One veteran with PTSD issues was referred to a private veteran support agency.

In November The Guardian Angels Assisted Living Centers, Elk River, MN completed vetting as the Voluntary Chaplain to the Transition Care Facility and authorized to visit (weekly) 13 staff and resident veterans.

Veteran Spotlight



E. John Telfer Jr

John was born in Santa Barbara, CA in 1944 and was raised in upstate New York. After graduating high school he

joined the U.S. Navy in 1962. He went to Basic training and A school for missile fire control Technician at the Recruit Training Command, Great Lakes. While attending a Navy school in San Diego 1965 he was asked to pick up a friends sister at the train station. She was visiting from Wisconsin. It was his future wife Diane. They had to alter their wedding date because it conflicted with a Green Bay Packers game her dad didn't want to miss. Packer fans were dedicated even back then. They were apart more than together for several years while he was at sea going to places like Japan, the Philippines, and Viet Nam. He missed his 21st birthday because of the way they crossed the International Date Line. Somehow they skipped the whole day. He spent much of the time on the USS Dale, DLG 19, a 535ft Frigate. It was commissioned the day after President Kennedy's assassination. And may be the only US ship ever commissioned with the flag at half-staff. The ship has since been decommissioned and was scuttled to become part of a reef somewhere in the Atlantic. He recalled memorable times such as getting high lined from one ship to another to attend a school and riding out typhoons. He related the time his ship traded some playboy magazines with the Russian Navy for pieces of a United States Navy Lockheed EC-121M Warning Star. It was on a reconnaissance mission and was shot down by a North Korean MiG-21 aircraft over the Sea of Japan. The plane crashed 90 nautical miles off the North Korean coast and all 31 Americans (30 sailors and 1 Marine) on board were killed, which constitutes the largest single loss of U.S. aircrew during the Cold War era.

After his discharge in 1969 he worked briefly for a company that worked on underwater cameras for oil rigs. They then moved to Wisconsin where he started his career in accounting with his father in law eventually becoming a CPA. Then he became a controller for the Oneida Indian tribes in Wisconsin as well as others.

Sometime during those years they had two sons and now have seven grandchildren.

Diane got a job offer to work in Accounting and Real estate in Las Vegas in 2001. John worked in real estate too. They lived there until 2020 when they moved to Elk River to become Volunteers at the American Legion post 112 and be closer to family. He and Diane have been involved with Fish fries, bake sales and the county Fair beer garden. And recently John showed his talent with a spatula making burgers while we were looking for a new cook.

We're glad to have them with us now.
